Anointing of the Sick/Eucharist for the Homebound

Contact a priest for ministry to the sick and aged at home or at a local healthcare facility. Upon request, the Eucharist will be brought to **any Catholic** who is seriously ill or homebound.

Confirmation

Baptized adults who have never received First Eucharist and/or Confirmation should contact a priest to complete their Christian Initiation through the RC.I.A. process.

ADVENT: THE SEASON OF HOPE AND ANTICIPATION

Celebrating Advent:

Evergreens and the Advent Wreath

Advent is a Christian festival that can be easily observed in the home as well as at church. With its association with Christmas, Advent is a natural time to involve children in activities at home that directly connect with church. In the home an Advent wreath is often placed on the dining table and lighted at meals, with Scripture readings preceding the lighting of the candles, especially on Sunday. A new candle is lighted each Sunday during the four weeks, and then the same candles are lighted each meal during the week. In this context, it provides the opportunity for family devotion and prayer together, and helps teach the Faith to children, especially if they are involved in reading the daily Scriptures.

It is common in many homes to try to mark the beginning of Advent in other ways as well, for the same purpose of instruction in the faith. Some families decorate the house progressively as Advent continues, or bake special cookies or treats, or simply begin to use special table coverings for meals. An Advent Calendar is a way to keep children involved in the entire season. There are a wide variety of Advent calendars, but usually they are simply a card or poster with windows that can be opened, one each day of Advent, to reveal some symbol or picture associated with the Old Testament story leading up to the birth of Jesus. One unique and specialized Advent devotional that can be used either in the home or in church is a Jesse Tree. This is an evergreen tree which is progressively adorned with symbols from the Old and New Testaments. At the end of Advent, this same tree (easily done with an artificial tree) can become the Christmas tree as the Advent symbols of the promise give way to the joyful ornaments of the fulfillment. These provide opportunities to teach children the significance of this sacred time, and to remind ourselves of it as well.

EUCCHARISTIC MINISTER AND LECTOR TRAINING

After Christmas, we will begin training sessions for Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. A candidate must be Catholics at least 14 years of age to become a Lector / 18 years of age to become a Eucharistic Minister, having received First Holy Communion and Confirmation. The candidate must be leading a life of faith in keeping with the function to be assumed, not bound by any canonical penalty legitimately imposed or declared, be reverential, respectful of his/her faith, and of good moral character; and if married, be in a valid marriage according to the law of the Catholic Church. Lectors should possess the necessary ability and talents to proclaim the Word of God in a clear, dignified, and effective manner. Extraordinary Ministers who will bring Holy Communion to the sick should be able to minister to the sick in a compassionate, prayerful, and sensitive way. They should possess psychological maturity and the ability to keep confidences, not discussing indiscriminately the condition of patients or their homes. Many signed up on Ministry Weekend.
